## Welcome back.

*You will be aware that our first week back has ended with the sad news yesterday evening that Queen Elizabeth II has passed away at the age of 96. In class today, teachers have shared Newsround's excellent report about her long and accomplished life with the children to provide an opportunity to discuss and reflect upon this historic occasion. There may be further national events arranged for schools in the coming weeks and I will keep you updated if and when we learn more about these.*

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I hope you had a lovely summer break. We have had a fantastic first week back in school. I have been so impressed with the way the children have settled into their new classes, but must give a special mention to the year 3 children who have settled in to Myrtle brilliantly, and also to our new Reception children who have been full of wide eyed smiles and questions this week. I hope your child has made as smooth a start as possible. If not, please do speak to their teacher so that we can work together to settle them in.

**Our School Environment...** Over the holiday and during the second Inset day last week, staff have been working extremely hard to prepare the classrooms for the children. We have really focused on de-cluttering and using calming colours to make the rooms as inclusive as possible and to help the children feel relaxed and able to learn. We have also installed sound dampening panels in the hall at Merrywood which look great and work brilliantly.

We would like to invite you in to see your child's classroom, meet their teacher and hear a little more detail about what to expect this year. Meet the Teacher meetings will be after school on **Monday 19<sup>th</sup> September at Merrywood and Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> September at Myrtle**. If you are unable to make it, we will upload the presentations to the website immediately afterwards.

**PPA Arrangements...** As you may be aware, every class teacher is entitled to time away from class for Planning, Preparation and Assessment time. This year we are returning to the model that was used before the pandemic, in which a team of specialist teachers spends a morning in each year group, providing the children with a carousel of activities. In years 1-2 these activities are PE (with Mr Goddard), Computing (with Mr Suanes) and Music (with Ms Holden). In Years 3 to 6 the activities are PE (with Mr Goddard), Computing (with Mr Suanes) and French (with Madame Turvey). Please note that for the next few weeks, Mr Suanes will be recovering from a knee operation and will be covered by Miss Ahmed. They have enjoyed a two day handover this week.

This means that one day a week your child may come home with a long list of the teachers they have had but please be assured it is very well thought out and is all about providing the richest possible learning opportunities for the children.

**Plea for Experts...** We LOVE welcoming family members in to school to share an interest or area of expertise linked to our curriculum. If you feel you would be able and willing to support our curriculum by coming into class, please email either school office and they will pass your offer on to the teachers. We are particularly keen to welcome people who would like to share their experience of a particular faith as this is so valuable for the children.

**Parentmail...** Thank you for responding to our communications before the summer and helping us to make the transition to parentmail for the start of this term. Whilst we have had positive feedback about the new arrangements for booking meals, I am very aware that for some this change has brought with it frustration and I apologise that there wasn't more clarity about this in the original communications.

The two key benefits for school in this system are:

1. Avoiding unrecovered parental debt (this has historically cost the school thousands of pounds every year)
2. Reducing food waste

In addition, it gives families the chance to choose meals that complement their planned evening meal and activities and avoids meal choices that their child may taste and then leave.

However, we recognise that the disconnect between the app and the menu makes the booking process complicated and so are taking steps to simplify this.

**This term:**

When you order, you no longer need to cross-reference the menu. Please just click the preferred option on the app (hot, cold etc) and teachers will ask your child to choose from the menu in class as they used to previously. Please note, your child will only be given this option if you have ordered (and therefore paid for) a meal on parentmail (Myrtle children only).

**Term 2:**

After half term, the food choices for each day will be embedded into the app so choosing a meal will take a matter of seconds – you will just click on the meal you wish to order. We will load the menu into the app a term at a time so you will still be able to get set up well in advance if you wish to.

From both a financial perspective and waste-reduction perspective, this system will be extremely valuable and I sincerely hope it is for you too. Thank you again for your patience as we work through the initial teething issues.

## Reception cont.

### Snacks

The school provides various different fruits for the children to have at snack time but they may bring in their own healthy snack from home if they would prefer.

This term's topic is 'Superhero Me' and we will be celebrating our unique, wonderful selves! We will each be sharing a special photo from home in circle time with the rest of the class - these can be anything that the children would like. Please could these photos be handed to class teachers by Monday 19th September. We can't wait to see what the children choose!

## Year 1

Welcome back! And what a brilliant first week back. Next Monday, is our 'Hook Day' when we launch our pirate topic. Please remember to send your child in dressed as a pirate. (Please don't feel the need to buy a costume - a home-made costume from old clothes is great.) If you have a clean cardboard tube, like a kitchen roll, please could your child bring it in on Monday next week. We are also collecting small cardboard egg boxes which we will be using in the next few weeks.

By far the most important things you can do with your child at home, whatever their level, is to hear them read and read to them. Your child will bring home a reading book this week once your class teacher has heard your child read. The book might be familiar but this is to give the children confidence to get back into reading after a big break over the summer.

Little Wandle reading groups (guided reading groups) will start in school next week. Your child will read in school 3 times a week with an adult and the book they read in this group will be written in their reading record when they do their first guided reading session. Please log in at home and read this book at home using the same log in details from last year. Ideally the children can read these books with 90-95% fluency. Your child will also bring a library book home that they have chosen themselves- this is intended as a book that they can share with an adult. (The adult reading.)

On your P.E. day please remember to send your child in your P.E. kits.

On a Wednesday afternoon, the Year 1 team meet as a team. The children will enjoy an afternoon of different activities - music, I.C.T and P.E. With other members of staff.

Please can the children bring in a waterproof coat as the children go outside in all weathers and a named water bottle so they can have a drink a playtime. ## Year 4

We hope you have had a restful and enjoyable summer. The children have come back full of enthusiasm and energy, and they've been settling into year 4 with their new teachers so well. In the meantime, a few messages from us. Each class will have two PE lessons a week. Please make sure they come to school **dressed in their PE kits**, appropriately dressed for the weather for outdoor lessons.

**This term all year 4 classes have PE on Thursday (indoor) and Friday (outdoor).**

## **Year 4 cont.**

Mr Goddard (PE), Mr Suanes (Computing) and Mme Turvey (French), our specialist subject teachers, will be taking all Year 4 classes on Friday mornings, covering the teachers' PPA (Planning, Preparation and Assessment) time. For additional staff development, PPA and leadership time Koala class will be covered on Wednesday afternoons by Mrs Asensi, Kiwis on Wednesday mornings by Mrs Asensi and Kangaroos by Mr Goddard on Thursday afternoons.

This term our topic is **'Water: All Around Us'**. We will be uploading key information, including a copy of our term 1 learning map, spellings and homework onto Google Classroom in the next week or two. Please do not worry about this straight away, as we will be letting you know more about this.

We look forward to working in partnership with you, and on ensuring the children have an amazing Year 4!

## **Year 5**

Year 5 currently have the last lunch slot at 1:00 due to the swimming rota. The children are quite hungry by then! If you can, please send them with a healthy snack to eat at playtime to keep them going. A reminder too that everyone needs a refillable water bottle every day and only water is allowed in school, not juice.

Please get the children to bring a coat into school every day. Some of them have been quite wet at playtimes this week, without coats. We usually go outside every day, even when it's raining.

This week we have sent children home with a topic spelling list. This is for them to learn by next Friday (13th) for a spelling test. We will then send a full term's list out, with 10 words for each week. If your child finds this too much, please focus on the first 6 of them, rather than struggle with the full set. Your class teacher may recommend this to some children where they feel this is more appropriate. It's really important that they know what the words mean, as well as how to spell them, so that they can use them in their own writing. Please check meanings if they are unsure.

Homework will continue to be on Google Classroom. We will send a reminder of log-ons in the next week. It will be posted online on Wednesdays and to be returned by the following Wednesday please. You can do this online, with a photo of handwritten work online, or on a piece of paper brought into school.



## Year 5 cont.

We are very keen to include real experience in our RE lessons. If you feel that you could share your faith experience, or know someone in your community who would come in and speak to Year 5, we would love to hear from you please.

We have given out new reading records and levelled reading books this week. Please encourage your children to read at least 4 times a week, including one or two sessions with an adult. This can be home books as well as library books. Get them to make a note in their record and teachers will review these on Fridays, when they can change their books.

Also a plea - to return any left over levelled or new library books that are lurking at home.

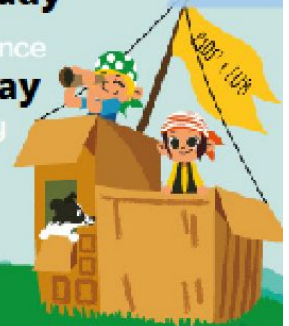

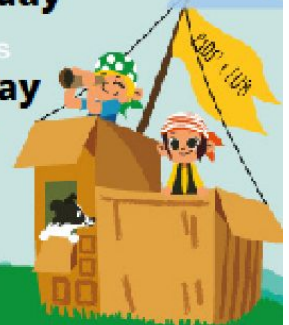

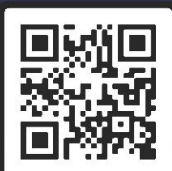
