Weduc Update

Weduc is upgrading their app with effect from 3rd April. If you are using the app and your phone is set to automatic updates, then there is nothing for you to do, as the app will update automatically on the 3rd April. The new app is called *Reach More Parents by Weduc*.

- What do app users need to do? If you do not have automatic updates turned on, you will need to re-download the app from the App Store if you have an iPhone or the Google Play Store if you have an Android.
- **Can I still access the same features?** Yes. The features you already use such as Newsfeed, Calendar and Messaging are still accessible.
- What's new? You can find a PDF document attached which will give you a detailed breakdown of everything that has changed in the app. Please note that the app offers features such as dinner payments that we will not be using. Only the existing features will be continued in the new app.

The information we have been sent suggests that the update will make navigation of the features of the app easier, and will also enable you to search within your newsfeed. We have been really impressed with the way Weduc have listened to our feedback over the last few weeks and I am delighted that these improvements have been made.
