

Sports Premium funding

Context

Schools must use the funding to make **additional and sustainable** improvements to the quality of Physical Education, Sport and Physical Activity (PESPA) they offer. This means that you should use the Primary PE and Sport Premium to:

- Develop or add to the PESPA activities that your school already offer
- Build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

Southville Primary School will publish the details of how we are using our Sports Premium funding within this document. The funding will be used to enhance and challenge children through activities and support from external agencies.

We will regularly update the document published on the website, as evidence of ongoing review into how we are using the money to secure maximum, sustainable impact.

- 5. Increased participation in competitive sport
