A warm welcome to Term 4 – we hope you had a lovely half term and enjoyed some time away from the computer screens. Spring is finally in the air and we are really excited about the changes that the new term is set to bring.

#### School reopening to all pupils

We are looking forward to welcoming you back on Monday 8th March. We are reviewing daily procedures and risk assessments ensuring they are in line with current guidance and will send out further communication around the routines and expectations early next week.

### Staffing changes

We have welcomed Miss Mohammad into our year 3 bubble and when the children come back to school she will take over the on-site teaching from Miss Thomas working with the Hedgehog class. Miss Thomas will continue to work remotely supporting the children through organised interventions. Miss Loughran will also not return to site for face-to-face teaching; she will continue to work remotely with identified children across the school.

Mr Suanes will take over and teach the Puffin class until the end of Term 6. He has worked with the children on a weekly basis and has a great knowledge of each individual and their learning needs. He is a qualified teacher and is extremely excited and enthusiastic to be taking on this role. We know the children will make progress through his supportive and nurturing teaching style. Mrs Fossard will continue to support the children through a number of remote interventions. She will also continue to meet with the Year 6 team on a weekly basis to discuss the children and plan for their needs.

We would like to thank Miss Thomas, Miss Loughran and Mrs Fossard for their continued hard work and wish them all safe arrivals in the future!

#### Reading books

We are requesting that all school reading books are brought in to be put back into circulation, so please have a good hunt around at home and send in any that you find. Teachers will be setting children up with new reading books over the first week back – it would be really helpful if you could update your child's reading record with a summary of what they have read during the latest lockdown (school books and others) and how they have got on with their reading. allow those of you who are putting in the extra effort to catch up. Also, it is having a positive impact on Southville Primary School's standing in the school leader board so thank you and keep logging on!


# Webinar: Keeping children safe online during COVID-19








**Year 4** - Charlotte's Web and the ear





Year 5 - Art competition entries & Viking timeline posters


