Implementation of statutory Relationships Education and Health Education



Year Group News and Reminders

Preschool

This week we have been talking about signs of spring, including blossom on trees, sensory play with seeds and growing cress from seed.





Family photos

Independence

We are supporting the children to become more independent in managing their belongings, putting on

their coats and shoes, and eating their food. Please help your child at home by encouraging them to do things for themselves and celebrating 'what I can do for myself'.

Reception

The Reception children have loved becoming dinosaur experts this term, exploring and discovering various species. In this last week of Term 4 we will be learning about the extinction of the dinosaurs. We will be thinking about how this happened and how other animals can become extinct too.

As with every week in Reception, the children will continue to explore our themed resources and range of continuous provision in their free play. Here is a rough outline of the whole-class activities:

Pantosaurus

Talking PANTS (The Underwear Rule) teaches children important messages, like their body belongs to them and they should tell an adult if they're upset or worried. 
