Fidget Toys

Over the past two weeks, fidget toys have become an increasingly familiar sight in the classroom. Unfortunately, they have been distracting some of the children from their learning. We have also had a number of incidents - involving trading these fidget toys - which have led to children being upset. As a result, from next week, we kindly ask that children do not bring them into school. We appreciate that, for some children, the fidget toys are therapeutic or serve a more necessary purpose, so if your child has an additional reason for needing one they will be allowed to keep one fidget toy on their desk during lesson time.

Online Safety

Each year, the children are reminded about the importance of being safe online as part of our ICT/PSHE curriculum. Unfortunately, there have been some incidents recently involving unkind messages being sent outside of school via messaging platforms, and even gaming platforms such as Roblox. In school, we have discussed the importance of being safe, sensible and kind online, promoting the message that you should 'only say things online you would be happy to say to someone's face'. We will be going over these messages in the coming weeks and ask you to support us by doing the same at home. It can be difficult to know how to start talking to your child about what they're doing online or who they might be speaking to. But talking regularly, like you would about their day at school, will help your child feel relaxed and mean that when they do have any worries, they're more likely to come and speak to you.
