Covid Update

As stated in the newsletter before half-term, we are taking cautious approach to easing restrictions. Most notably, we are continuing to have lunches and playtimes in class bubbles. National Public Health guidance has not changed, however, we encourage families to continue to be vigilant during this time. Please take time to read the latest updated guidance from Bristol City Council which is attached as a separate document.

Sports Day

Sports Day will take place on Thursday 17th June (Years 1 and 2 in the morning and Years 3 and 4 in the afternoon) and Friday 18th June (Years 5 and 6 in the morning) at Compass Point playing fields (South St Park). One year group will complete track events whilst the other year group will complete 'field' activities. Children will be put into groups of 10. We have made the decision to stick to class groups. Early Years Sports Day will take place at Merrywood on Friday 18th June in the morning. Can you please ensure your child:

- Wears their house colours and suitable footwear to school.
- Brings a bottle of water and a healthy snack to take with them
- Puts on sun cream / brings a hat if it is a hot day

As stated previously, in line with government guidance on keeping group sizes below 30, we are unfortunately not able to invite parents to attend the event this year.

During Monday's assembly, the children thought of reasons for being awarded a Southville Star, so that we can celebrate a particular quality each week in Term 6. This week the focus chosen by the children is: caring for others & being a good friend. We will be sharing the names of the Stars during assembly on Monday.




NumBots

Year 3

Gosh, Year 3 have made a flying start to their learning this term. The new Covid guidelines mean that we have at last been able to move into table groups for most of our lessons which is so good for teamwork and our collaboration skills 2

What a fantastic WOW Day we had (see some of the grass heads we made below). Please do upload a photo of your grass head, when it has grown, to Google Classrooms stream so we can all see them. Hedgehog class, Mrs Hayes is making a display of them in the class window if you would like to print yours off and bring it in.

<u>Maths</u> – We are learning about 2D and 3D shapes and their properties. The properties and the language are proving tricky, so any spotting of these shapes when out and about will be helpful. We are thinking how many 'vertices' (corners), right angles, curved and straight edges (sides), parallel lines, perpendicular lines these shapes have.

<u>Tables</u>

Keep practising your tables. You are doing a fantastic job! Don't forget the division facts too eg: 3x8=24 divided by 3=8

Practise your x2, x3, x4, x5, x8 and x10 tables. Then your x6 and x7 if you know the others really well. Please try to practice 3 or 4 times a week. It really helps their maths.
