We have posted this as homework on Google Classrooms (we do have paper copies if requested). This is a 2 week creative homework that we hope the children will very much enjoy. They will need your help and permission to submit their entry online and to view some of the bee videos/information. If you/they do not want to submit their entry to the competition organisers, that is fine. However, please can all pupils upload a copy of their bee garden design to Google Classroom for us to enjoy. Should this be a problem, then do stick it into their homework book and bring it in on Wednesday 30th June. We very much look forward to seeing their garden designs.

Tables

In maths this week we have been exploring **mass** by weighing objects. Any practice you can do at home with your child reading scales (kg and g) when weighing out ingredients and/or looking at the weight on cans and packets, would really help consolidate their knowledge and understanding.

Keep practising your tables. You are doing a fantastic job! Don't forget the division facts too eg: 3x8=24 divided by 3=8

Practise your x2, x3, x4, x5, x8 and x10 tables. Then your x6 and x7 if you know the others really well. Please try to practice 3 or 4 times a week. It really helps their maths.
