

Southville School Development Plan 2021-22... This week's front page is dedicated to sharing with you a summary of this year's School Development Plan. We are already seeing the impact of this work and we are excited about the year ahead. Later in the year I will be inviting you to contribute to the long-term vision for the school which will then steer future plans.

Phonics and Reading



We are introducing a new phonics and early reading scheme called Little Wandle into EYFS and Key Stage 1. It builds on the way your children have been taught so far but with closely matched (brand new!) books and resources. In Key Stage 2 we are going to embed a more consistent approach to how we teach reading.

Play



Outdoor Play and Learning

We are working with OPAL to develop our play offer across both sites. Children spend the equivalent of a day a week at playtime so it is important we make the most of this valuable time. We are currently evaluating our play provision and as the year goes on, the opportunities for creativity, performance, construction and physical play for all children will increase.

Writing



Within the immersive approach to our curriculum we are making sure that the writing skills our children need are taught rigorously, smoothly building upon previous learning. We are ensuring that handwriting and spelling expectations in each year group are clear and shared in a way that children can embed in their day to day writing.

Enhancing Learning



Across the school we are taking time to develop the learning environment and are also working with the DELTA project (led by the Education Endowment Fund) which is helping us to support our amazing LSA team in their vital roles. In EYFS, changes to the curriculum are leading us to develop our approach to facilitating and assessing the children's learning.

Curriculum Leadership



The first cycle of the new curriculum was interrupted by covid, and so we are making sure that, within our immersive approach, the children's knowledge (eg scientific or historical) is developed systematically as they go through the school. We are also continuing to establish curriculum leadership teams to support future work on the curriculum.

Whole school values...

We continue to build our whole school values as part of our ongoing commitment to the children. As part of this we would like to consult with each family. We have been doing this in stages to ensure we capture the breadth of opinion across the school community and the final stage is our Key Stage 2 families.
