Happy New Year!

I hope you had a peaceful and restful holiday and managed to avoid the various illnesses that were floating around. It was great to welcome the children back to school on Wednesday and it has been a really lovely week and a very positive start to term.

Tuesday's Inset Day... At Tuesday's Inset Day we continued our Values work, and then worked in Key Stage teams to make final preparations for the new reading approach we are introducing this term (more info about this coming soon!). In the afternoon we had the official launch of our OPAL (Outdoor Play and Learning) project. And while all of this was going on, some staff were refreshing their safeguarding and first aid training! It was a busy day but it has set us up for a really exciting Spring term of developments which we are looking forward to sharing more news of in the coming weeks.

Covid Guidance... As you may be aware, there are some changes to the national covid guidance either in place or imminent. I thought it might be useful to summarise the guidance below:

ONGOING: Covid symptoms must be followed up with a PCR test

NEW: if you/your child is symptom-free and gets a positive lateral flow result you <u>do not</u> have to get a follow-up PCR test but should begin the 10 day self-isolation period.

NEW: Children and double vaccinated adults can end the 10 day isolation period after 7 days provided they have had two negative lateral flow results 24 hours apart on the 6th and 7th day and do not have a temperature.

From 11th January: Identified close contacts who are children or double vaccinated <u>do not</u> have to isolate provided they have daily negative lateral flow tests and remain symptom-free (if symptoms develop, isolation begins immediately).

Covid-related Planning... You will be aware that we return to school against a backdrop of national uncertainty regarding current covid rates and what the next few weeks will hold. To reassure you, I wanted to let you know that we are planning for two possible implications of an increase in cases:

- 1. <u>Increasing covid cases in school:</u> We will soon be sharing an overview of our updated covid response plan so you have clarity over how in-school measures will be stepped up if we get a cluster of cases in one class, classes or multiple year groups.
- 2. <u>Reduction in staffing levels:</u> Autumn term brought with it huge pressures on staffing due to the usual illness-related absence, covid-related illness and isolation periods compounded by the impact of both of these factors on the availability of supply staff. Mr Potter and Mr Commander are brilliant at coming up with creative solutions and our staff team are relentlessly flexible and resilient, however if staffing levels reduce to a critical level at any point this term we may be forced to implement short term solutions. Next week I will share with you what these solutions may be so that you are as well-informed as possible. In line with the government guidance, we will do everything we possibly can to ensure the children remain in school, but may have to scale down aspects of our usual provision for a short period of time.

Sorry for the strong Covid theme this week but I hope it's useful!
