Bridge Closure

This week I received a message from Transport Engagement department at Bristol City Council related to essential repairs that will be taking place on Vauxhall Bridge. I have copied the full message below in case you have not received this information through other channels.

From Transport Engagement:

With Gaol Ferry Bridge restored and reopened, we now need to carry out essential and urgent repairs to Vauxhall Bridge to make sure it is safe and can remain open for many years to come. This is the next part of our £16 million repair programme for bridges along the New Cut of the River Avon.

Vauxhall Bridge is a Grade II listed footbridge connecting Cumberland Road and Coronation Road, between Southville and Spike Island. Work to secure the long-term future of the bridge will include removing the surface, repairing the structure and replacing some cross beams, as well as masonry repairs and repainting the bridge.

The £3 million restoration project at Vauxhall Bridge is expected to take up to two years and the bridge will remain closed throughout. The length of the repairs will depend on the condition of the bridge upon further detailed inspection, which is only possible when the full structure can be accessed once the bridge is closed. Diversion routes will be signposted, directing pedestrians and cyclists via either Gaol Ferry Bridge or Ashton Avenue Bridge. There will be no access between the Chocolate Path and Vauxhall Bridge throughout these works. The Chocolate Path will be open throughout the Vauxhall Bridge works.
