Whole School Assembly Theme

During our Monday assemblies this week, Mr. Commander continued to talk about our school value of Courage. He read the story 'The Snail and the Whale' by Julia Donaldson to get the children to think about 'leaning into the unknown'. They discussed how new experiences and opportunities can sometimes be daunting but the rewards can be huge. In the story, the tiny snail takes a risk by hitching a ride on the tail of a huge humpback whale and in doing so goes on an amazing journey around the world. We want to encourage the children to be confident and courageous enough to try something new and 'go for it!'

Myrtle Street Congestion

I have noticed an increase in the number of people driving to our Myrtle Street site and parking illegally while they drop off or collect their child and several parents and carers have also shared their concerns with me.

Please remember the double yellow lines and yellow zigzags in Myrtle Street both mean no parking is allowed. This means that parking safely and legally in Myrtle Street is pretty much impossible so I urge you to park safely and legally elsewhere and walk the remaining part of the journey.

The PCSO is aware of the issue and is intending to drop by at the end of the day to monitor and speak to parents individually about this where required.

Furthermore, the increased number of cars is making the final part of their journey to school dangerous for our children. If you are one of the people who who are currently driving along Myrtle

Street at drop-off and pick-up time, please leave home earlier to park further away or consider walking, cycling or scooting to school.

I know parking around our school is a nightmare (just ask any of our staff!) but parking unsafely and/or illegally is definitely not the solution! Thank you to the families who are already taking these very helpful steps.
