I am currently a serving Head teacher at Oasis Academy New Oak. I have worked in education for the last 12 years, spending all my time in South Bristol. I have worked as principal in one of the most deprived schools in England (Hareclive E-Act Academy) and was part of the leadership team that received an 'Outstanding 'Judgement in 2019. At New Oak we received a 'Good with elements of Outstanding 'Judgement (up from Requires Improvement) after being in post for 18 months.
