

Critical Incident in South Bristol

As you will be aware, there was a critical incident in Knowle West at the weekend, in which two teenagers tragically lost their lives. I have been attending regular briefings regarding the city-wide response to this tragedy this week and will continue to do so over the coming weeks.

As we come together as a City to try to deal with, process and ultimately avoid a repeat of the tragic events of Saturday 27 January, all school leaders have been asked to ask parents/carers to monitor closely their child's social media activity. We are aware of unhelpful social media posts circulating, which are largely sharing misinformation or rumouring. Whilst we do not for one moment think that our children are the source of the posts, we advise that under no circumstances should they share, like or comment on such posts. We also strongly recommend that they remove themselves from any groups where such posts are being shared.

Our thoughts are with our neighbours in Knowle West and all those affected both directly and indirectly by this tragedy. Whilst I am not aware of any direct connection to any family within our community, if you or your child has been affected by these events, please do let us know.
